#### **ACTIVITY POLICY**

PSSEMR School and PU College give significant importance to holistic development of children. The school and college is committed to creating high quality co-curricular program which complements academic program. The activities scheduled draw equal importance to academic confirming our commitment to nurture and patronize sports, literature and performing arts.

Students will develop a variety of skills through participation in co-curricular activities, including activity specific skills, collaboration and sharing, social values and behaviours etc. which they can transfer to their lives now and in the future.

The activity programme at the school and college provides the students with:

The opportunity for character development (e.g. to be humble in victory and be gracious in defeat, help each other win etc.)

The opportunity to represent school and college in various outbound and inbound competitions.

The opportunity to build lifelong habits.

The opportunity to learn about teamwork, collaboration, decision making, commitment, generosity etc.

The opportunity to relax and nurture mental health.

The opportunity to make new friends.

The opportunity to improve skills, to develop positive work ethic, to exercise and understand the community better.

### Policy for class X and PUC -II

- 1. We allow student belonging to class X of CBSE, IGCSE and PUC-II to take part in only one outbound activity. The student of class X CBSE and IGCSE is free to attend any number of inbound activities as per rules of the events conducted from time to time, however student of class PUC-II will be allowed to participate in inbound activities only after assessing prevailing situations.
- 2. There shall be no restrictions in participating in academic activities like MUN, debates, Olympiad, Quiz, Government competitions, Robotics etc.
- 3. Parental consent for any outbound activity is mandatory.

- 4. Students willing to participate in an out of school/college activity must fill the activity participation form duly signed by all the subject teachers. This is to ensure that the teachers feel that the child is self-directed to manage time for academics and activities. An NOC must be submitted to the warden as per boarding policy.
- 5. Any activity falling on the days of unit tests, exams will not be permitted, unless approved by the principal in consent with the parent. If permitted the student must write the missed assessment within one week of reporting back to the school/college.
- 6. No student will be allowed to participate in any event after the month of December unless it is a National level competition. In such a case the ramifications related to final exam is to be bared by the parent and the student in consultation with the concerned body conducting the event.

#### Activities at the School and College.

- 1. Activities are monitored by an activity coordinator. Each club activity and inter-house cultural and sports activity is monitored by a teacher or a coach.
- 2. A student can choose a maximum of two clubs, can attend only one club activity during the school hours but can manage to attend both club activities after school/college hours.
- 3. A student shall choose sports/games as per sports policy of the school.
- 4. A student must respect rules and regulations of each club framed from time to time and must conform to its spirit.
- 5. Regular attendance and commitment to the club activities chosen throughout the season must be intact.
